

THE NO SABO KID'S BILL OF RIGHTS

From No Sabo to Ya Sé Real Talk Edition

1. Freedom of Speech, Religion, and Expression

(First Amendment)

You have the right to speak your mind, practice your religion, post what you want, protest, and call out injustice.

No Sabo Translation:

"I can talk back, speak up, and call out BS as long as I'm not threatening anyone or lying in court."

BUT You Can't:

Threaten to shoot up your school even as a "joke."

That's called a criminal threat, and it's not protected speech.



2. Right to Bear Arms

(Second Amendment)

You can own a gun (but not just any gun, anytime, anywhere)

You have the right to have a gun for protection but there are laws on who can own one, what kind, and where.

No Sabo Translation:

"Yeah, I can have a piece but I better check my state laws and not pull up wild."

BUT You Can't:

Walk into school with a gun just 'cause "it's your right."

Schools = gun-free zones. Instant felony.



3. No Forced Quartering of Soldiers

(Third Amendment)

Nobody can make you let soldiers crash at your house

The military can't just post up at your crib, no matter what's going on.

No Sabo Translation:

"Ain't nobody from the Army moving into my room. Ever."

BUT You Can't:



4. Freedom from Unreasonable Search & Seizure

(Fourth Amendment)

Cops need a warrant or real reason to search you

They can't search your backpack, car, or phone without permission, a warrant, or something called "probable cause."

"They can't just roll up and search me 'cause I 'look suspicious.' Nah. Show me the paperwork."

BUT You Can't:

Hide drugs in your car and say, "You can't search me!"

If they smell it or see it in plain view that's "probable cause."



5. Right to Remain Silent + Due Process

(Fifth Amendment)

You don't have to say sh*t that can get you in trouble

You can stay silent. You don't have to talk to cops. And they can't lock you up without charging you fairly.

No Sabo Translation:

"I can say, 'I ain't saying nothing till my lawyer shows up.' And they have to respect that."

BUT You Can't:

Lie to the cops or give a fake name.

Remaining silent is legal. Lying is a crime.



6. Right to a Fair and Speedy Trial

(Sixth Amendment)

If you're charged, you deserve a real shot to defend yourself

You get a trial, a lawyer (even if you can't pay), and a chance to tell your side.

No Sabo Translation:

"If they charge me, I get my time in court not stuck waiting in jail forever."

BUT You Can't:

Demand your trial tomorrow or delay it forever.

The court sets the schedule you don't get to pick the date.



7. Right to a Jury Trial (Civil Cases)

(Seventh Amendment)

You can sue and have a jury decide

If someone causes you harm, you can take them to court and have a jury of regular people decide what's fair.

No Sabo Translation:

"If someone screws me over, I can sue and regular people decide, not just some suit."

BUT You Can't:

Sue someone over petty drama like, "She stole my man."

Civil court = actual damages, not your feelings.



8. No Cruel and Unusual Punishment

(Eighth Amendment)

They can't do you dirty just 'cause you're locked up

No crazy-high bail, no beatdowns, no torture. You're still a human being.

No Sabo Translation:

"If I mess up, they can't treat me like trash just 'cause I'm locked up."

BUT You Can't:

Expect zero consequences if you hurt someone.

Punishment has to fit the crime but you'll still face real consequences.



9. More Rights Exist Than Just These

(Ninth Amendment)

Just because it ain't written doesn't mean it ain't a right

You still have rights even if they're not in this list. Like privacy, education, or traveling freely.


No Sabo Translation:

"Even if it's not in the Constitution, I still got rights they can't just take."

BUT You Can't:

Invent a right like "I got the right to skip school."

The courts decide what's real not your vibes.



10. States Make Their Own Rules Too

(Tenth Amendment)

The feds don't run everything

States can pass laws as long as they don't go against the Constitution. So what's legal in one state might be illegal in another.

No Sabo Translation:

"Every state got its own rules so don't pull a Cali move in Texas."

BUT You Can't:

Claim, "It's legal in Cali!" if it's illegal where you are.

Local laws still apply.
